Introduction

The Workbook consists of exercises which reinforce what the students have practiced in class. These exercises are an integral part of the lesson plan and should, theoretically, be given in the context of the lesson. If, however, the class is not able to finish all the exercises in the time allotted, these exercises can be done at home.

When the exercises are done in class, the students should receive immediate feedback at the end of each exercise. Teachers should circulate in the classroom and check on students' progress.

Exercises which appear in the Workbook allow the students to use and reinforce the vocabulary they have learned in context. Students are encouraged to clarify the meanings of the new vocabulary and to use them in sentences. Grammar rules which are exposed in the Student Book are also reinforced in the Workbook. In most units, the tapescripts students will hear in the Listening section are reproduced as an exercise in the Workbook. This allows the students to read the information they have acquired through listening.

Finally, at the end of each unit, the students will be asked to do the Test Your Knowledge section in class. This section is a halfhour round-up of the whole unit and includes the basic vocabulary and grammatical rules taught in the unit. These tests do not replace progress tests. They are a guide for both the student and teacher. The student is able to see his strong and weak points at the end of each unit and the teacher is able to gauge what material must be reviewed before a progress test is given.
