- Plan writing instruction using five key instructional approaches to writing – modelled,

shared, interactive, guided, and independent writing.

Description:

Readers and writers are involved in similar activities. Readers establish meaning for groups of words based on their knowledge. Writers take ideas, thoughts, and emotions and transfer them onto paper. Since both reading and writing focus on meaning, development in one reinforces progress in the other: students learn to read and write better when the two processes are linked. In teaching reading and writing, teachers use a balance of instructional approaches; modelling, direct instruction, guided instruction, and facilitation of students' independent learning and practice. Research indicates that young children develop into strong readers and writers when their teachers focus on foundational areas of literacy development and provide intentional literacy experiences.

The workshop examines these foundational areas of literacy development; alphabet letter knowledge/letter recognition, phonological (including phonemic) awareness, letter–sound correspondence (phonics), concepts about print and books, oral

Title : How to Use Classroom Language in the Math and Science Classes

Description: Teaching and learning mathematics or science depends on language. While mathematics or science is often seen as language free, in many ways learning them fundamentally depends on language. For students still developing their proficiency in the language of the classroom, the challenge is considerable. There are many practical strategies which can help to overcome this barrier. Math and science teachers need to know these instructional strategies that can be used to help students gain access to the language they need to learn; and how they can support students in continually building a deep understanding of language and content. Thus, teachers need to know how to establish classrooms that are supportive of using and learning language. The workshop examines how teachers can:

 provide engagement and discussion opportunities that socialize students to the language of the discipline through structures and routines that develop skill in disciplinary discourse;

Description:

Students learn faster and more effectively when instruction is matched to their individual preferred styles. Individual learning styles depend on cognitive, emotional and environmental factors, as well as one's prior experience. In other words: everyone's different. It is important for teachers to understand the differences in their students' learning styles, so that they can implement best practice strategies into their daily activities, curriculum and assessments. By the end of the workshop, teachers will become more familiar with what a learning style is, where learning styles come from, and what types of learning styles there are. They will also realize why they should know about learning styles, identify and use different teaching methods and activities that suit different learning styles.

Description: Success in writing greatly depends on a student's attitude, motivation, and engagement. The writing process takes these elements into account by allowing students to plan their writing and create a publishable, final copy of their work of which they can be proud. The session addresses students' need for inspiration for ideas which comes from reading with other techniques, as well as drafting and redrafting their work. Teachers can help their students think carefully about each stage in writing by guiding them through the writing process repeatedly throughout the year and across various content areas.

> This workshop explains the writing process and offers practical methods for applying it in the classroom to help students become proficient writers.

-Recognize the difference between teaching grammar explicitly and inductively

(implicit learning)

-Plan to teach grammar inductively

Description: Grammar can be motivating and fun! The secret lies in the way it is approached. Grammar has "meaning". We can make it more meaningful by presenting structures combined with a series of short activities, by using internet, visuals or any tool that might suit our teaching context. Thus, a boring "verb class" can be transformed into an interactive and motivating one.

> Teachers often rely on a deductive approach, one in which a grammar target is presented in a lecture format with follow-up practice in the form of drills and exercises. While this method certainly has its place in the language classroom, an inductive approach is a more engaging and effective way for students to acquire grammatical structures. In an inductive approach, students analyze examples of a target structure and attempt to figure out the rules on their own. In this workshop both methods will be addressed, with the focus on why an inductive method works so well in today's language classroom. Participants will be presented with creative ways to teach

The workshop will also deal with how to write testing items to assess students' comprehension of texts particularly Grade 9 official exams.
